# State of play for Australian beef industry



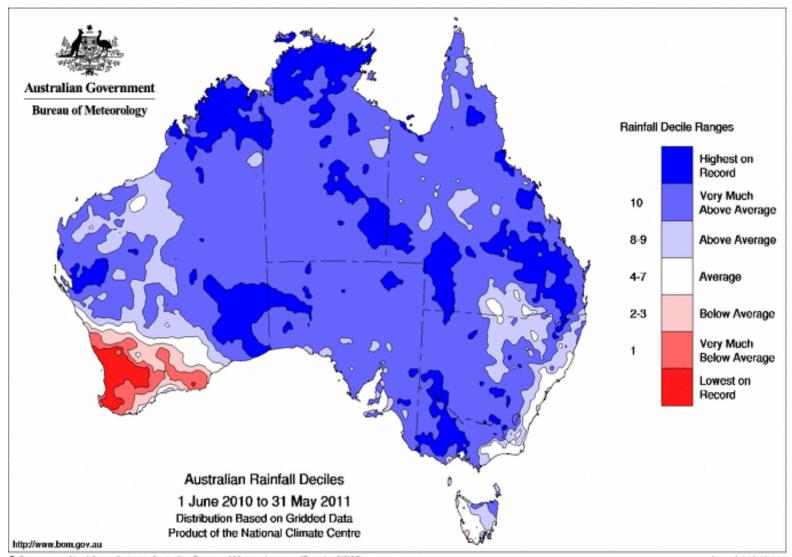
- After a decade of drought, most cattle producing regions are experiencing a very good season.
- Herd rebuilding underway, excellent young cattle prices
- Competition for land in Southern Australia grain vs sheep vs beef…

## BUT....several issues have emerged

- Slow down in Japan, high A\$ and competition from the US has hit heavy cattle prices
- Uncertainty for northern cattle producers with live exports
- Global economic concerns, especially to US

# Drought replaced by flooding in past year...except in WA

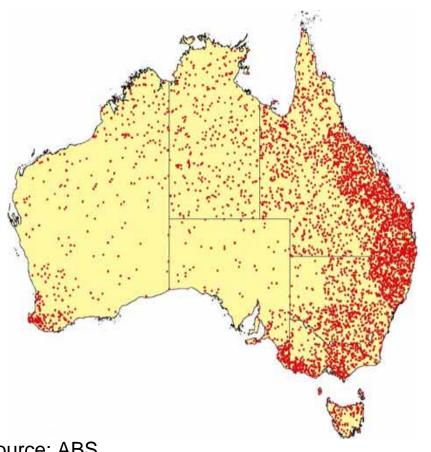






## **Australian cattle distribution**

# 2010 Australian Climate Highlights

### Northern Australia

 Wettest dry season (May-Oct) on record for top half of continent

### NT

 Wettest year on record with 927mm rain

#### Southwest WA

 Driest year on record with 392mm rain

### SA

 3<sup>rd</sup> wettest year on record with 362mm rain



### Northern Tropics

Spring 2010 has the warmest sea surface temperatures on record

#### QLD

- Wettest year on record with 1110mm rain
- Major flooding in southern
  & inland areas

### Murray-Darling Basin

- Wettest year on record
- Water storages up to 80% from 27% one year ago

### NSW

- 3<sup>rd</sup> wettest year on record with 805mm rain
- Major flooding in inland areas

### VIC

- Major flooding in northern area
- 5th wettest year on record with 858mm rain

### TAS

Near average rainfall

### Australia

- Third wettest year on record with 690mm rain
- 10 years ending 2010 warmest decade on record
- Sea surface temperatures 0.54° C above average and warmest on record
- Sea surface temperatures warmest decade on record by 0.15° C
- Wettest spring on record for NSW, QLD and NT

## Impact of flooding in 2010-11



- Disrupted cattle flow/slaughter across all states, but impacted Queensland industry the hardest:
  - January = lowest nationally in 22 years
  - February = record Queensland February slaughter
  - March = heavy rain sees further flooding
  - April = Cattle supply disrupted by holidays
  - May = 2<sup>nd</sup> highest May Queensland slaughter
- Weight of cattle offered has been much higher due to the better season in 2010 & so far in 2011.
  - January to April = 286kg/head cwt, up 9kg on 2010

# \$\$\$ impact of the flooding



While the break in the drought has been welcome, the heavy rain and flooding during the past year has had significant financial implications:

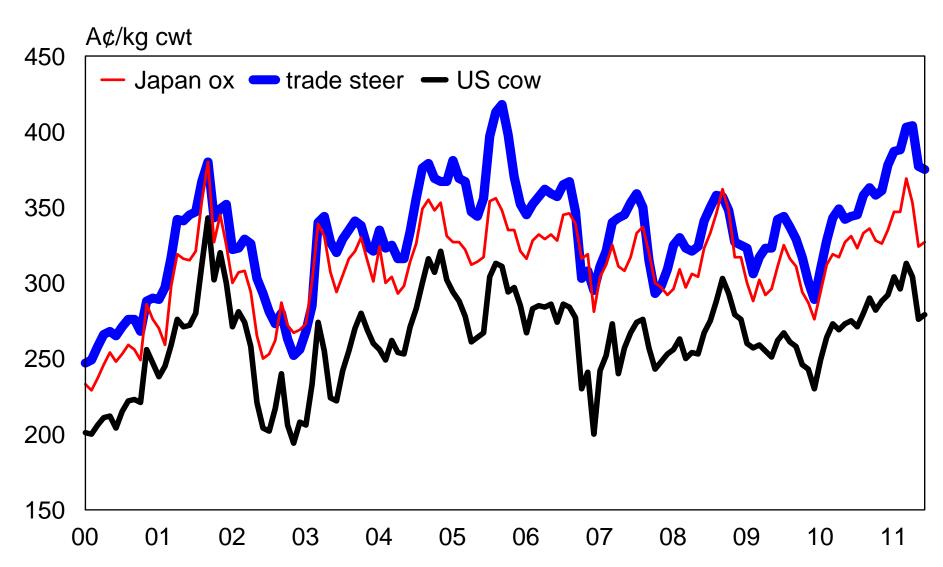
- Unable to get cattle to market delayed by up to 9 months in some regions (no road access, no sales)
- Some stock losses but minimal given extent of flooding
- Damage to roads, fences, pastures etc....





# Australian saleyard cattle prices mia

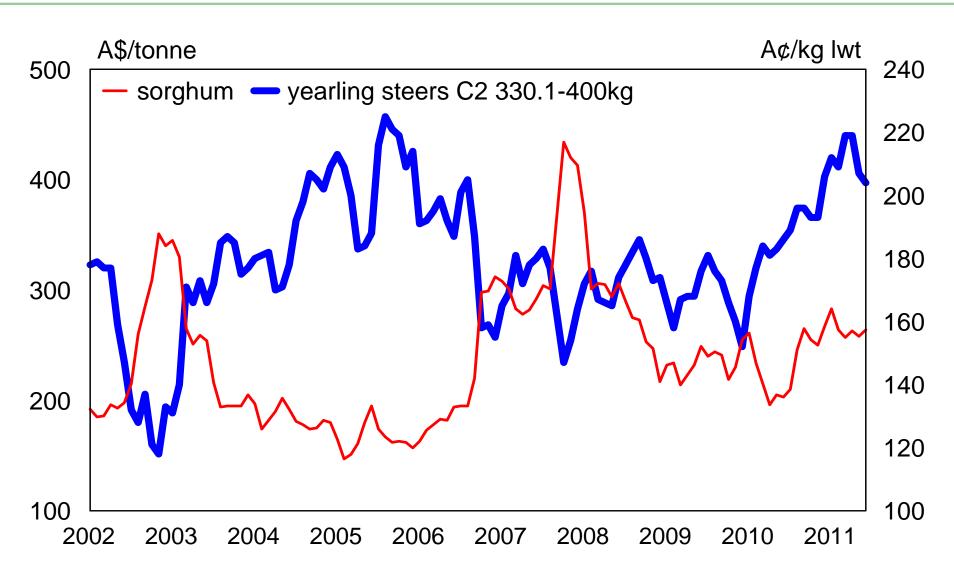

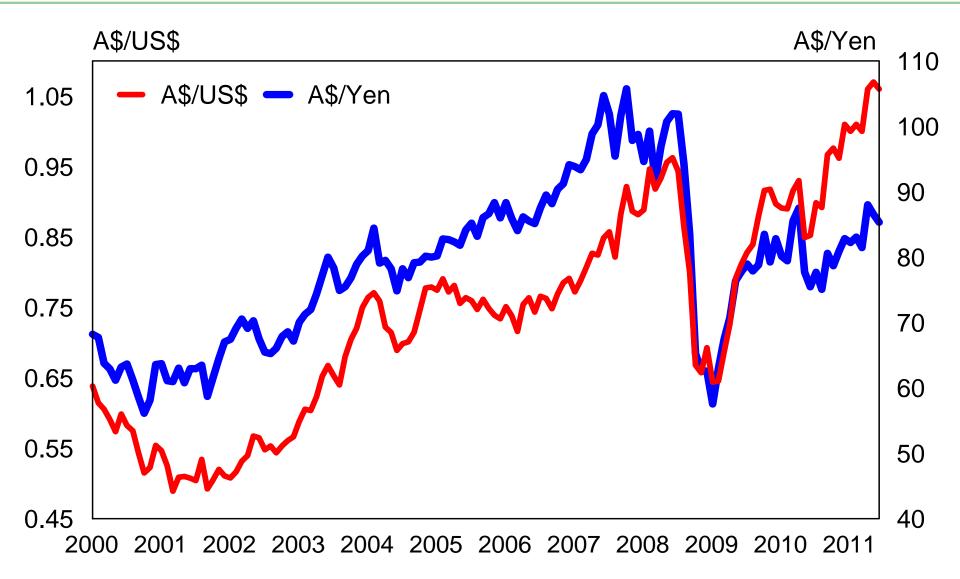
# Australian feeder cattle and feed grain prices

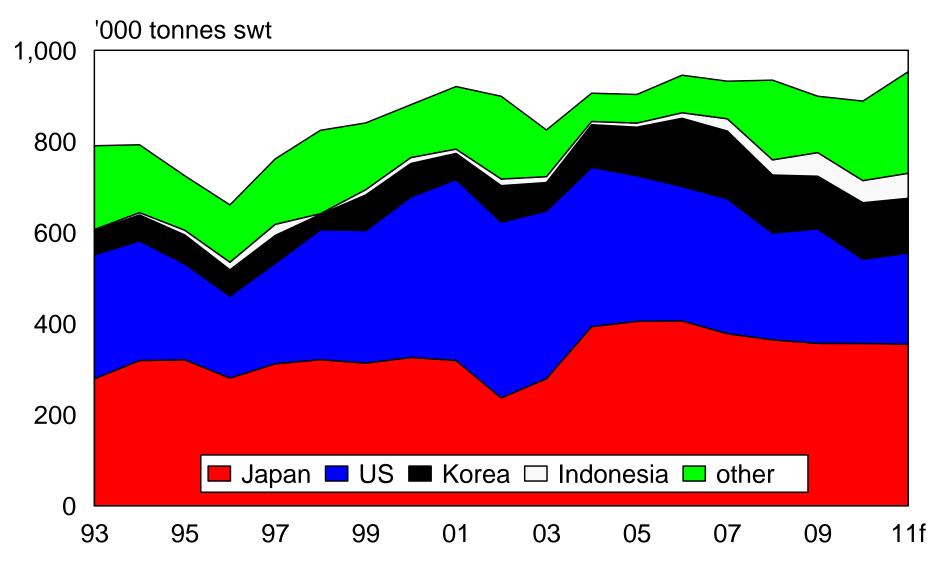
# A\$ against US\$ and Japanese ye

# Australian beef exports by key destinations

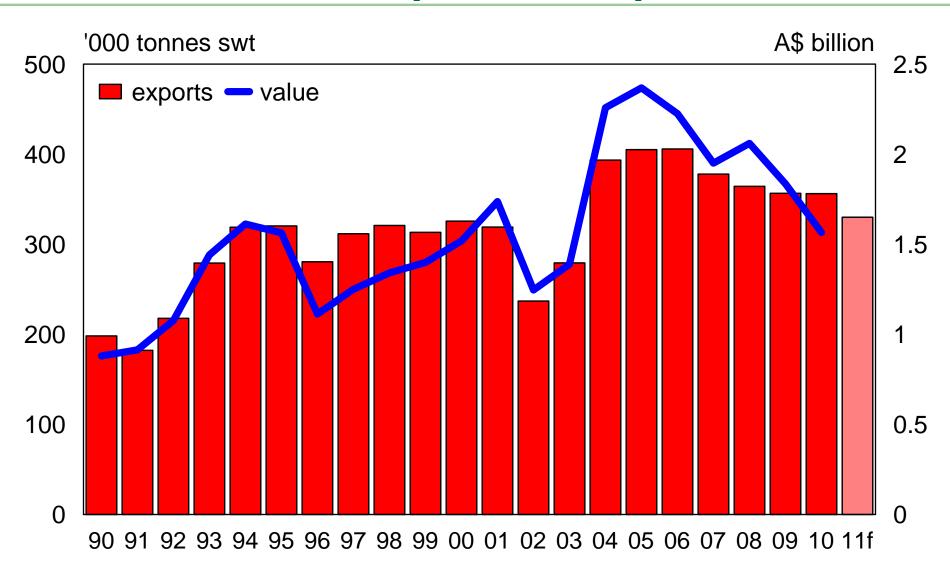

# Australian beef exports to Japan MEAT & LIVESTOCK AUSTRALIA



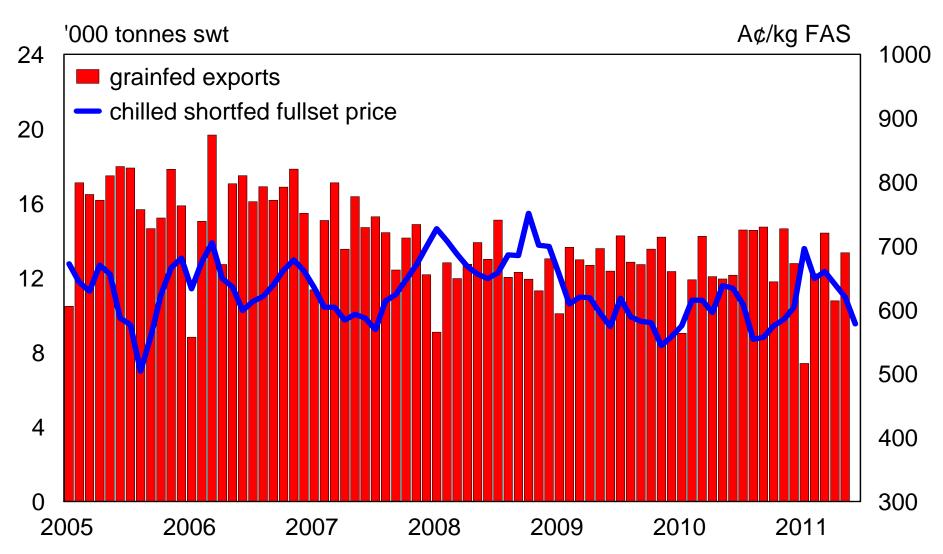

# Australian grainfed beef exports and prices to Japan

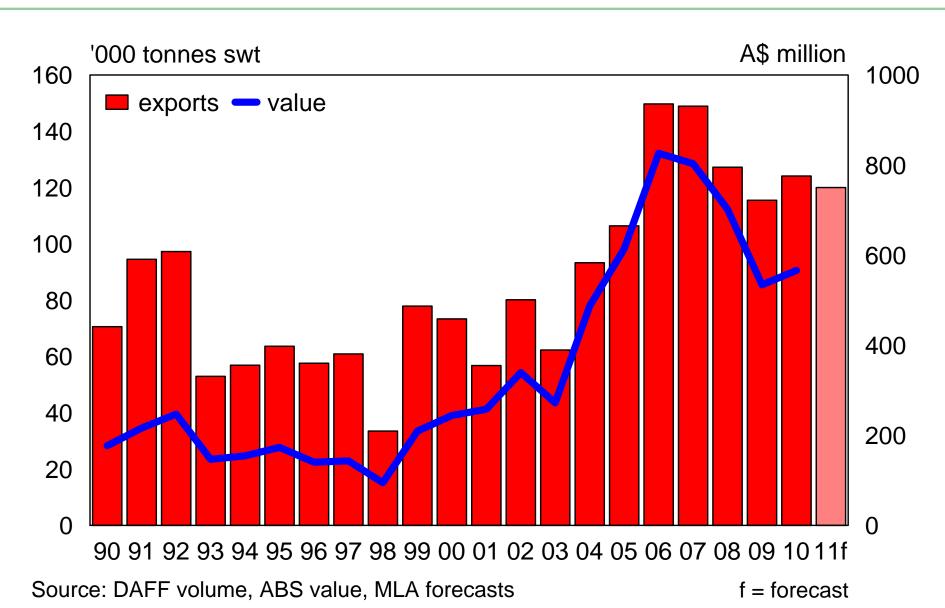

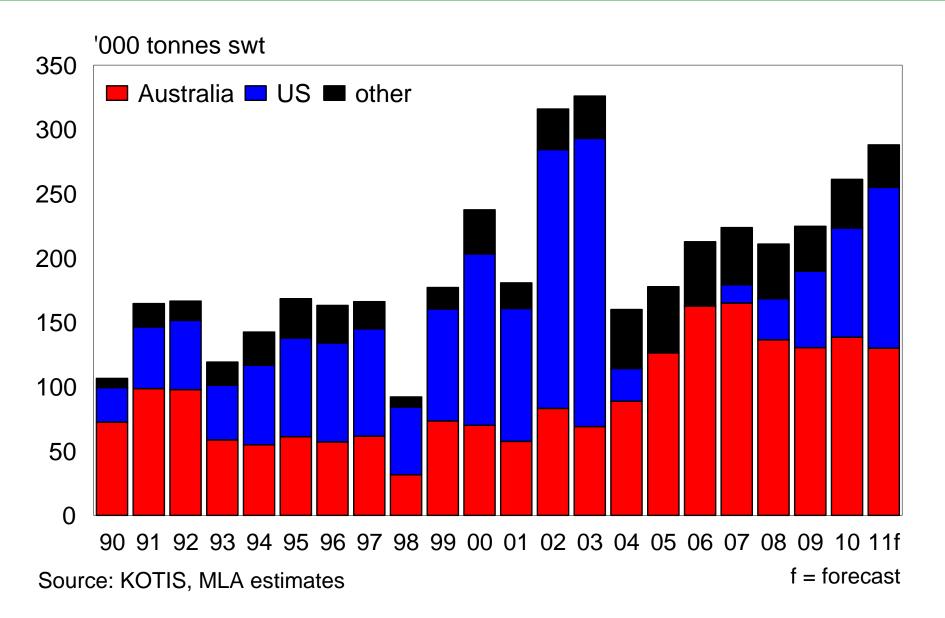

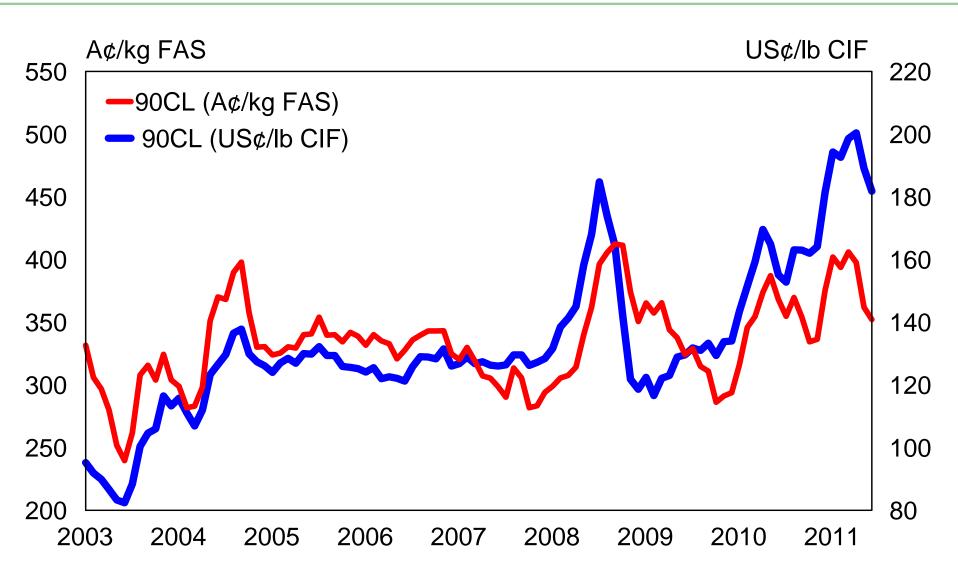

# Australian beef export prices to the US

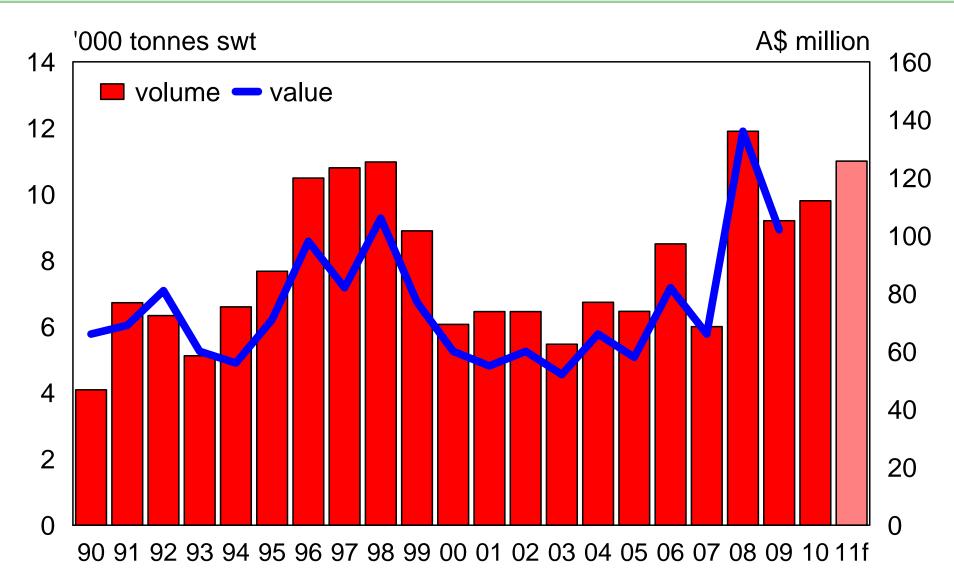

## Australian beef exports to the EU mla



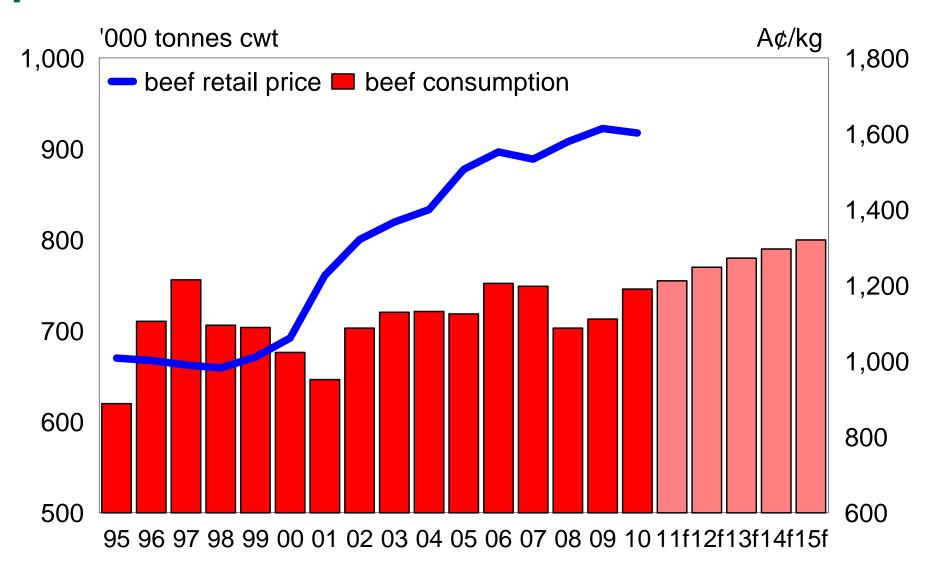

# Beef consumption and retail price



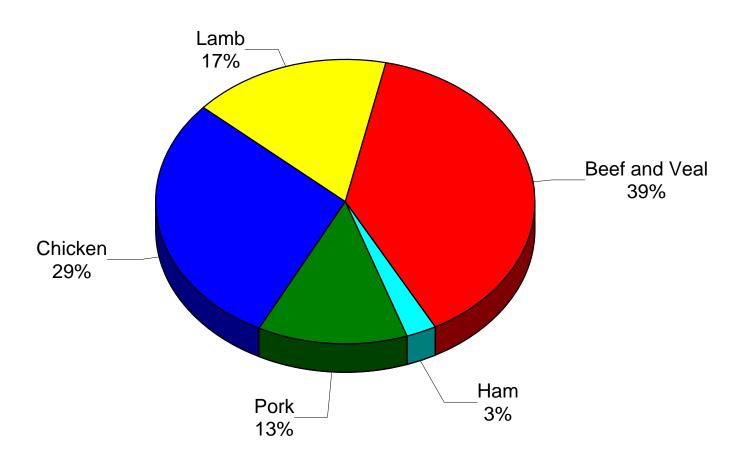

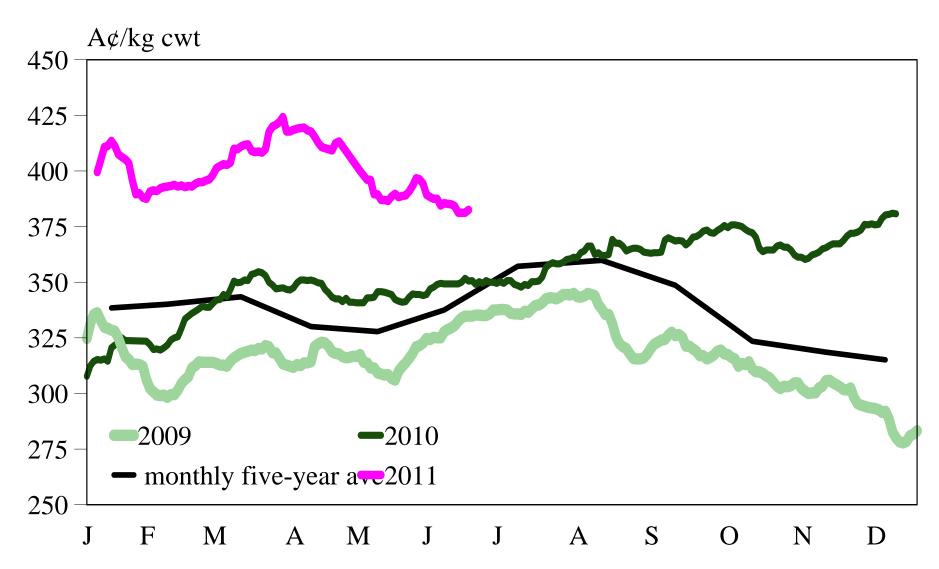
# Fresh meat category share at Australian retail 12 months to April 2011

# Eastern Young Cattle Indicator (EYCI)

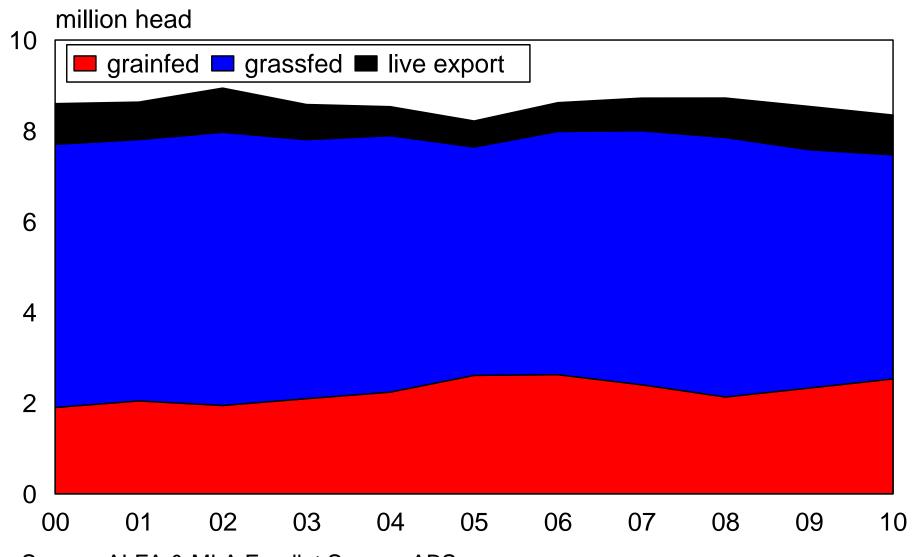

## Australian cattle turnoff

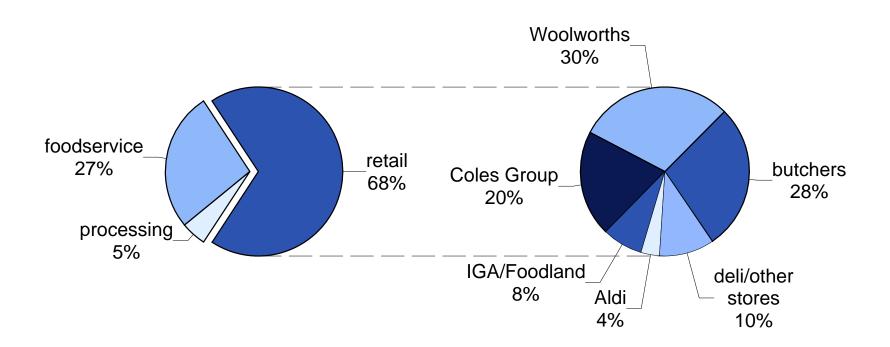

# Supermarkets locked in beef price cutting



- In late 2010, Australia's 2 largest supermarket chains started a price war, targeting many items, including beef.
- As a result, retail beef prices in Australia have dropped in the past year, but driven by price discounting.
- Reports have indicated that sales have increased, but could be due to increased volumes of beef being sold in Australian market due to tough export conditions.

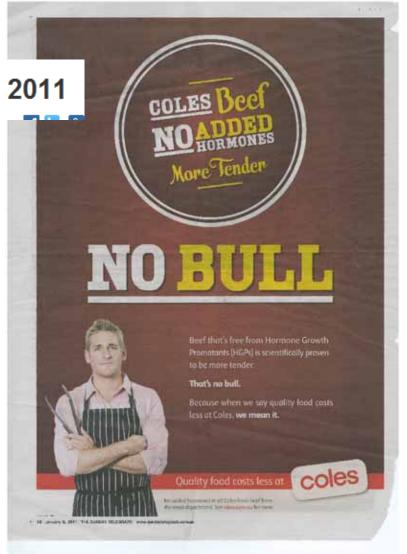

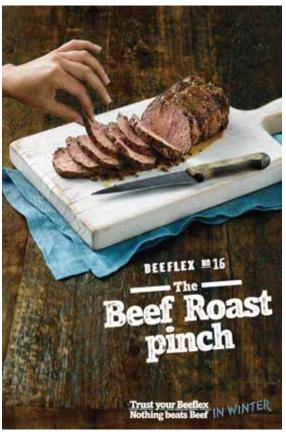


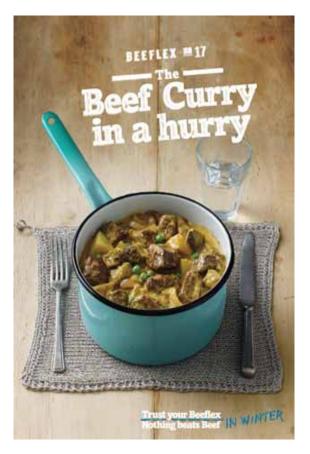
