Research Assistant

for the research project "International Comparative Analyses on Greenhouse Gas Reduction in Arable Farming". The position includes the possibility to work on a PhD thesis. The temporal contract-limitation is based on § 2 Abs. 1 S. 1 Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz.

Responsibilities:

- Identification of global hotspots and significant sources of greenhouse gas emissions in the field of arable farming on the basis of statistics and scientific literature research
- Identification, specification and quantification of options to avoid greenhouse gas emissions in the global arable farming field together with academic partners on the ground and on the basis of scientific literature (case studies)
- Data gathering on typical production processes within the agri benchmark cash crop context
- Economic evaluation of adaptation options and their political feasibility
- Involvement in the Thünen topic "Climate and Atmosphere" and specifically in "THG Reduction Strategies" and "Climate Protection Policy"
- Preparation of reports, lectures and academic publications
